

# **RELOCATION OF ASSAM RIFLES FROM AIZAWL**



- On March 15, 2025, Union Home Minister Amit Shah attended the ceremony where
   land was officially transferred from the Assam Rifles to the Mizoram government.
- This marked the relocation of Assam Rifles' camp from the center of Aizawl to
   Zokhaw Song, fulfilling a demand that had been ongoing for over 35 years.

## **KEY HIGHLIGHTS OF THE EVENT**

- Speech by Amit Shah:
  - Union Home minister said that this decision is important for the development of Aizawl.

- The Assam Rifles camp in the heart of the city had been a barrier to the city's growth and expansion.
- He explained that for 35 years, there was a demand to move the camp because of the tough landscape and lack of space, which made it hard to build more in the city.
- The shift to Zokhawsang shows the government's commitment to the people of Mizoram and their desire to improve the city's development.
- o He stressed that this move is not just about shifting the camp, but about supporting the growth of Aizawl, helping with infrastructure development, and addressing the needs of the people.

# **HISTORICAL CONTEXT**

- The demand for moving the Assam Rifles camp has been raised since the late 1980s.
- The Assam Rifles, India's oldest paramilitary force, was stationed in the center of Aizawl, making it hard for the city to expand due to the surrounding mountainous terrain and crowded city areas.



 Over the years, local leaders and civil society groups have been pushing for the camp's relocation so that Aizawl could grow and modernize more easily.

### **ABOUT ASSAM RIFLES**

#### Role and Function:

- Assam Rifles is one of the 6 Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs) under the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA).
- Primarily tasked with conducting counterinsurgency operations in northeastern India.
- Operationally under the control of the Indian Army, commanded by an officer of Lieutenant General rank.
- o Its headquarters is in **Shillong**, unlike other CAPFs that are based in New Delhi.

#### HISTORY

- Founded in 1835 as the Cachar Levy, originally to protect British tea estates from tribal raids.
- Evolved into the **Frontier Force** across the Assam border.
- In 1870, reorganized into 3 Assam Military Police Battalions.
- Renamed as Assam Rifles in 1917. ADDRESS:

- Post-Independence, it participated in the Sino-India War (1962) and the Indian Peace
   Keeping Force (IPKF) in Sri Lanka (1987).
- Expanded significantly from 17 battalions in 1960 to 46 battalions today, playing an essential role in counterinsurgency and peacekeeping operations in Northeast India.

## **ABOUT CAPF**

The Central Armed Police Forces (CAPF) are a group of seven security forces that function under the Ministry of Home Affairs, tasked with national security, border protection, and law enforcement duties.

Retirement Age: The Union Home Ministry has set the retirement age for CAPF personnel at 60 years

- Date Announced: March 11, 2025
- Scheme Name: PM-YUVA 3.0 (Prime Minister's Scheme for Mentoring Young Authors)
- Launched By: Ministry of Education, Department of Higher Education
- The Ministry of Education has launched **PM-YUVA 3.0**, a scheme aimed at mentoring young and emerging authors in India.
- This initiative focuses on **training authors under the age of 30** to encourage a culture of reading, writing, and book creation in the country.

# PM-YUVA 3.0

Prime Minister's Mentorship Scheme for Young Authors

- 50 authors of up to 30 years of age to be selected
- Scholarship of Rs. 50,000 per month for 6 months
- Entries can be submitted in 22 official Indian languages and English

## **KEY FEATURES**

#### Goal of the Scheme:

- The main aim of the scheme is to support young writers and help them develop their writing skills, allowing them to contribute to the literary world and promote India's culture and knowledge system.
- This is the third edition of the **PM-YUVA Scheme**, following the success of the first two editions, which saw large participation from young authors across 22 languages, including English.

#### • Selection Process:

- Contest: Young authors can apply by submitting their proposals for books on specific themes. An All India Contest will be held on the website mygov.in, where interested candidates can submit their proposals until April 10, 2025.
- Evaluation: Proposals will be reviewed in April 2025, and the selected authors will be announced in May-June 2025.
- Training: The chosen authors will receive mentorship from experienced writers and mentors between June 30, 2025, and December 30, 2025.

- Themes of Focus: The PM-YUVA 3.0 scheme will encourage young writers to explore the following themes in their books:
  - Contribution of the Indian Diaspora in Nation Building: Writing about how people of Indian origin have contributed to the progress and development of the country.
  - Indian Knowledge System: Highlighting the rich history of India's educational and philosophical traditions.
  - Makers of Modern India (1950-2025): Writing about the key figures and events that have shaped India in the modern era.
- Implementation and Support:
  - The **National Book Trust, India** (NBT) will act as the **Implementing Agency** for this scheme, ensuring its smooth execution through structured mentorship phases.
  - The scheme is designed to strengthen India's cultural ties and promote the idea of 'Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat' (One India, Great India) by encouraging literary diversity and fostering deeper connections among.

# • Benefits for Young Authors:

- The scheme will help develop a new generation of writers who can express fresh
  perspectives on important subjects related to Indian culture, history, and
  knowledge.
- The authors will be given opportunities to participate in **literary festivals** and engage with established writers and intellectuals.
- Trust, India and translated into other Indian languages, promoting cultural and literary exchange across the country.

# FOREX RESERVES OF INDIA

#### Context:

- Date: Week ended March 7, 2025
- Key Update: India's foreign exchange reserves increase by \$15.267 billion to \$653.966 billion.
- India's foreign exchange (forex) reserves saw the sharpest rise in over two years, jumping by \$15.267 billion, reaching a total of \$653.966 billion during the week ending March 7, 2025, according to data released by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI).

# **Key Highlights:**

- Reason for the Sharp Increase: The sharp rise in forex reserves is mainly due to the
   \$10 billion forex swap conducted by the RBI on February 28, 2025.
- In this swap, the RBI bought dollars against the rupee to provide additional liquidity to the financial system.

These assets include foreign currencies like the euro, pound, yen, etc.

The increase of \$13.993 billion reflects both the accumulation of foreign

currency and the impact of exchange rate fluctuations, such as the

appreciation or depreciation of the currencies held in the reserves relative

to the US dollar.

Gold Reserves

o Explanation:

The value of India's gold reserves fell by \$1.053 billion.

This decline can be attributed to fluctuations in the price of gold in the

global market, where gold is traded in US dollars.



■ The overall value of India's gold reserves stands at \$74.325 billion, reflecting the amount of gold held by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI).

# • Special Drawing Rights (SDRs)

Change: +\$0.212 billion

Total Amount: \$18.21 billion

# **Explanation**:

- SDRs are international reserve assets created by the International
   Monetary Fund (IMF) to supplement member countries' official reserves.
- India's SDRs increased by \$212 million to a total of \$18.21 billion.
- The increase reflects India's share of IMF's allocation of SDRs to member countries, which can be used for transactions with other countries or the IMF.

#### IMF Reserve Position

Change: -\$0.069 billion

Total Amount: \$4.148 billion

o Explanation:

- India's reserve position with the IMF decreased by \$69 million, bringing it to \$4.148 billion.
- This reserve position represents India's quota and the balance available in the IMF's financial resources that India can access as part of its membership.

# TREND IN FOREX RESERVES

- The **forex reserves** had been on a **declining trend** recently due to revaluation and the RBI's interventions in the **forex market to stabilize the rupee** and manage volatility.
- At the end of **September 2024**, India's forex reserves had hit an **all-time high** of \$704.885 billion before starting to decline.


# Implications and Significance:

- The increase in foreign exchange reserves will provide India with a stronger buffer to withstand external economic shocks, such as currency fluctuations or global financial uncertainties.
- The \$10 billion forex swap was a key strategy used by the RBI to inject liquidity into the system, helping manage the domestic economy and supporting the rupee.

# **CONCLUSION**

India's foreign exchange reserves saw a sharp increase in the week ending **March 7, 2025**, driven mainly by the RBI's \$10 billion forex swap. This rise strengthens India's financial position and helps ensure stability in the face of global economic challenges. While there was a decrease in gold reserves, other components, especially foreign currency assets, saw significant growth.
